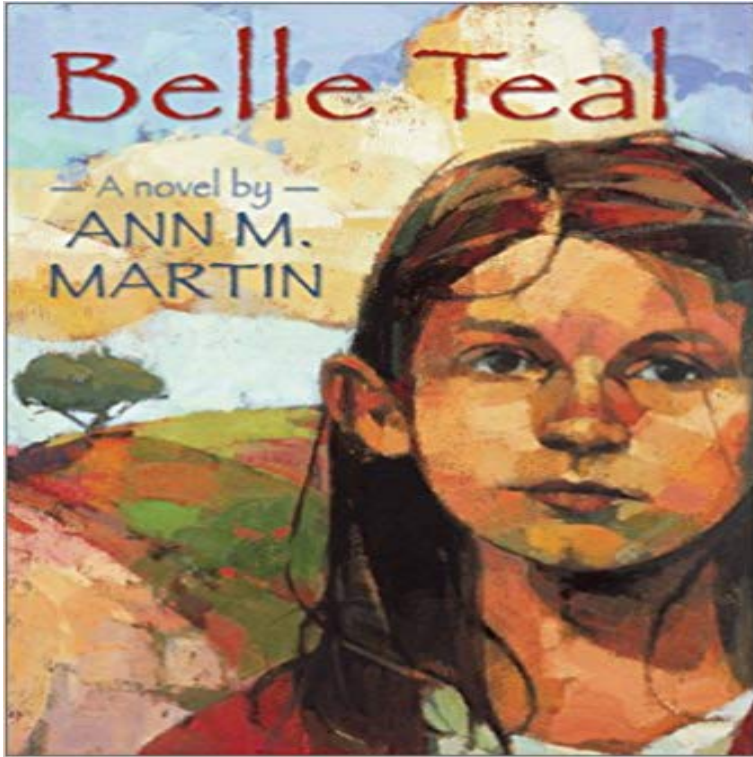


Belle Teal
