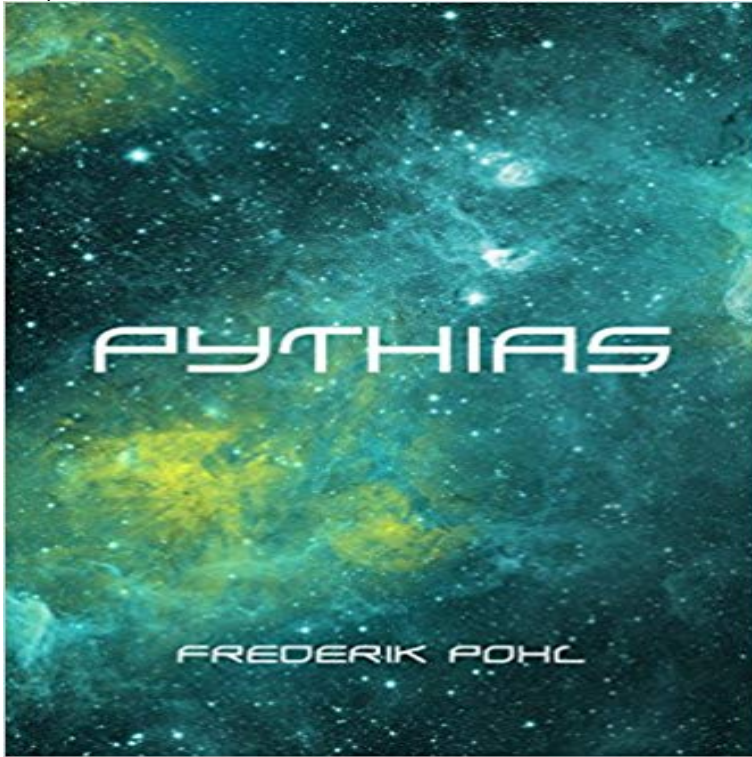


# Pythias
