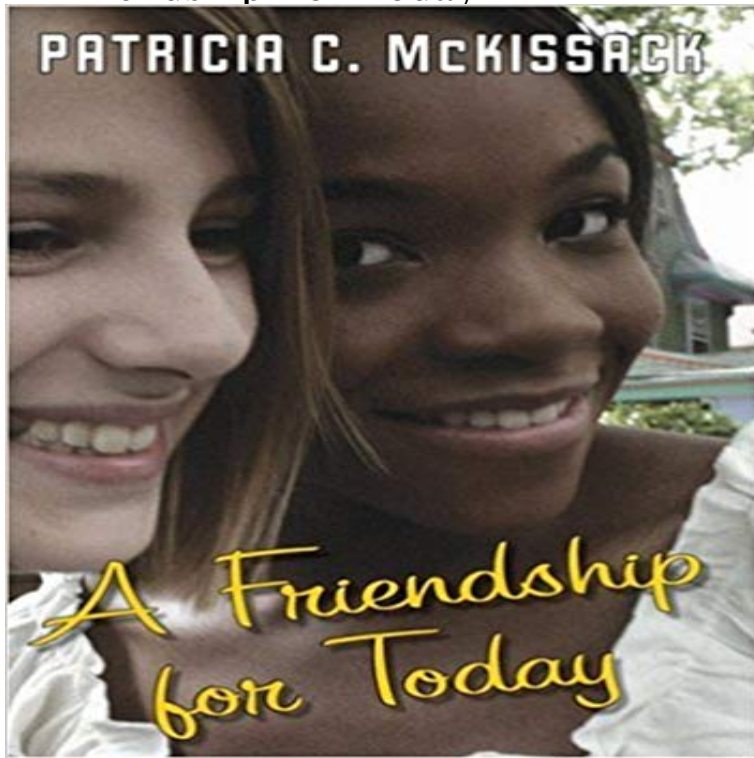


A Friendship For Today
