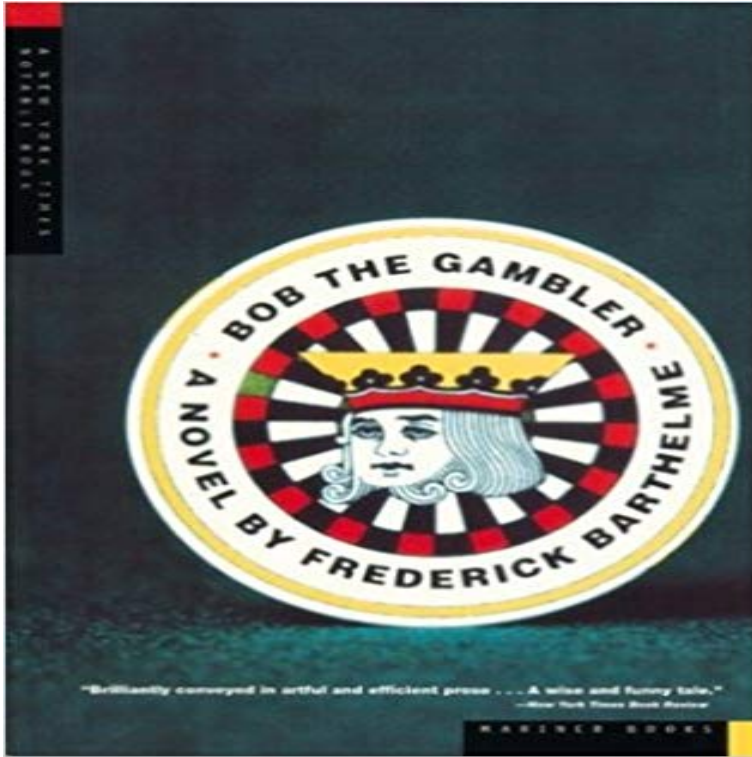


# Bob the Gambler
