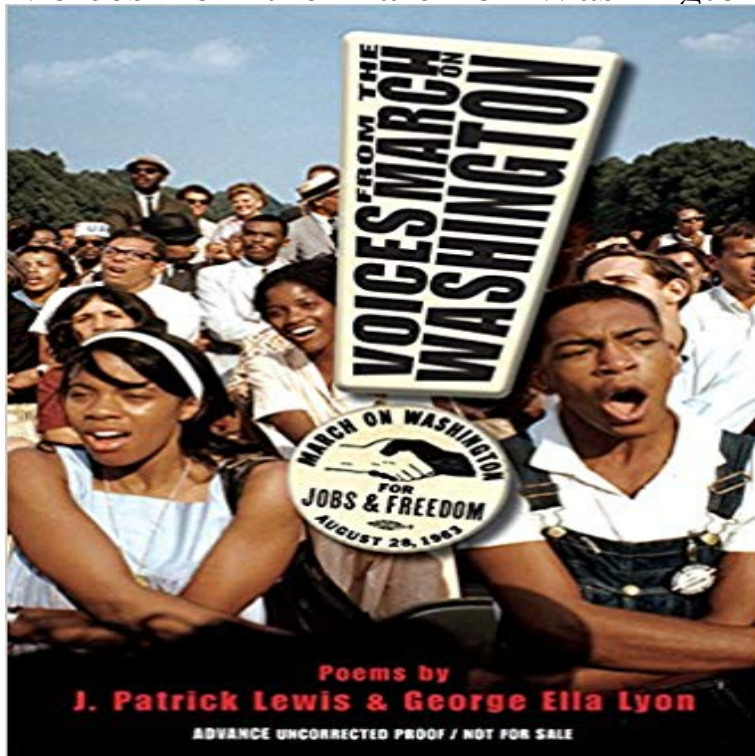


Voices from the March on Washington
