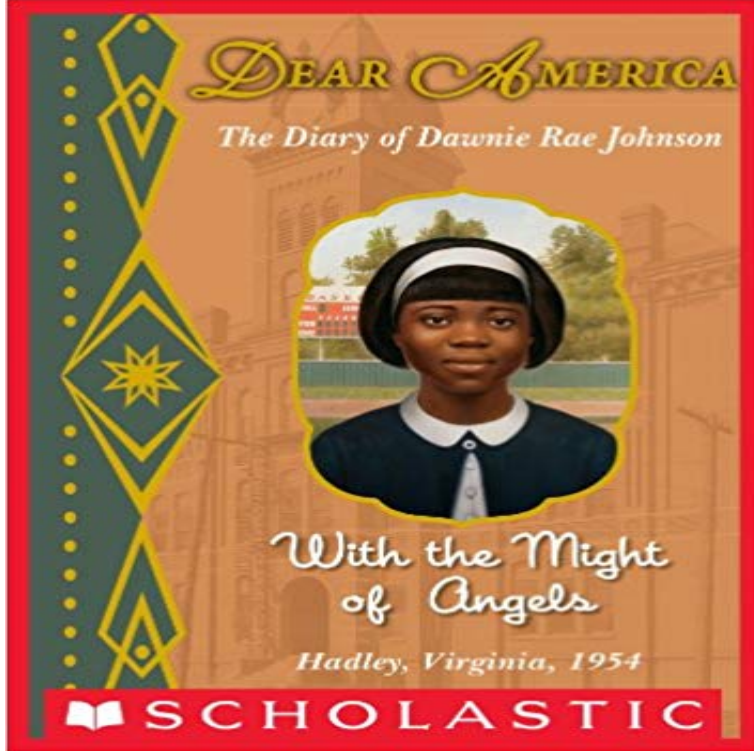


Dear America: With the Might of Angels
